Drummond Field Report by Rick Ward

The west end field is better than ever! That is what most members are saying after the removal of the rocks and brush to the north of the runway. However, there has been much speculation as to how far things will go. Read on.

Drummonds has won a tender to provide sand to the Trail Road Waste site for the next two years. They have informed me that they will be excavating north and east of the runway to a depth of between 5 and 40 feet.

The depth will be determined by the material that they find. For example, it appears that they have already hit clay at the northwest corner, which might mean no more digging there. Excavation will continue until freeze up this fall and then continue next summer.

Drummonds has given us no indication that our tenure at the site will be shorter than the 10 years originally discussed. Andre (613-822-9314) or I (613-723-2661) will be pleased to answer any questions and will inform the membership of any new developments - don't bug the equipment operators.

A word of caution: Continue to use the field according to our present safety regulations, but in addition, stay away from the earth moving equipment. In particular, avoid landing or taking off when equipment is crossing or about to cross the end of the runway. *(Note: No matter how big your plane is, I'd still bet on the dump truck to come out ahead.)*

With all the new activity at the field, it is imperative that the last one out chains the gates together – lock thru lock. This will enable other club members to open our lock, or Drummonds to open theirs, to gain access to the field.

The lawn tractor has a new key so anybody can start it. Just move the throttle to high, push the brake all the way in, pull out the choke and turn the key. Once running, push the choke in. There are separate foot pedals for forward and reverse. The blades are engaged with a button on the right. If you think the grass is too long – cut it. There is plenty of grass for everyone to have a turn at the wheel.

The Ottawa Remote Control Club (ORCC) hosted the annual Doug Pinhey Float Fly on Saturday, June 23, 2007 at the club's float field located 30 minutes south of Ottawa near Kemptville, Ontario. Almost immediately, Richard Barlow, MAAC president, and Claude Melbourne, Ottawa Valley ZD, arrived on the scene to take pictures and wish us well with the event. They had a busy day with at 2 other events to attend that same day. Their presence and support was greatly appreciated.

As the morning progressed, more and more pilots and spectators arrived. We had 13 registered pilots and at least another 30 spectators. The parking lot was full including a small travel trailer to make the day more comfortable for one modeler's spouse. In addition to our own club members, we were happy to welcome flyers from Ajax, New York State and other Eastern Ontario clubs.

The variety of float planes was quite remarkable. There were a number of flying boats, a Seawind, a North Star, a beautiful old timer on floats, and numerous high wing monoplanes like Cubs and Cessnas. John Weeks, past president of the ORCC, displayed his very large, partially built Grumman Goose powered by G23s which he is scratch building. It should be ready for the 2008 Float Fly.

We featured a BBQ chicken diner which was well worth the trip to Kemptville on its own. Blend in some float flying and you have a winning combination. Shahram Ghorashi prepared the chicken in a great marinade 3 days before the event. I know everybody enjoyed their chicken dinners and I heard a few asking for his marinade recipe.

This year's event coincided with the 60th anniversary of the De Havilland DHC-2 Beaver. Peter Olshefsky, a long time ORCC member and aviation mechanic, brought an original DHC-2 maintenance manual. It was passed around all day. Two models of De Havilland's Beaver on floats were at the event but, unfortunately, were not ready to fly. One was in blue and white RCMP colours and the other in a bright yellow and white.
