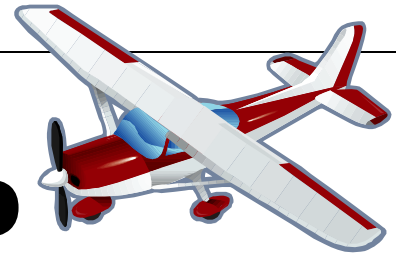

So, members are asked to please observe all safety rules, and to conduct your flying operations in such a way that your fellow modelers can enjoy the activity safely. If the pattern for the circuit is going one way and you are going the other way, it makes people nervous. Loudly yell out all your takeoffs, low passes and landings, so that other pilots are aware of your intentions. When you are in the air with other people, it makes them nervous if you spend a lot of time very close to their pilot station. And if another modeler

approaches you and asks you to modify the way you conduct your operations, please be diplomatic and think about how your actions affect others. We are all in this for the enjoyment.

Venturers Visit To The ORCC – Brent Norman

On Sept 8th we had the Merrickville Venturers visit us to experience RC flying. The Venturers are part of the Boy Scouts of America for boys and girls from 14 to 20 years old. We had previously planned their visit for May/June timeframe, but unfortunately the weather would not co-operate. This time the weather provided bright sunshine and light winds. There were 8 teenagers along with their Scout master (recently bitten by the RC bug) who came out for an evening of flying a radio controlled trainer. I had access to 2 NexStars that I test flew previously and set up for these new students. I had ORCC members Scott and Calvin help set up the planes and get them ready for when the venturers showed up. We had a brief safety talk and then a mini flight ground school. Mike Toner and I had the trainers on buddy boxes and planned to have each teen fly around for 3-4 minutes each. I was flying close to 17 minutes trying to get all of my gang of 4 as much flight time, before landing to quickly refuel and go again. It wasn't long before the majority could fly the airplane around the sky and go where they wanted to go. They could fly straight passes down the runway or do graceful left or right turns under complete control. No-one had any previous experience, other than a lot of computer gaming time. All 8 venturers were able to get in a couple of flights during the limited time we had before it got too dark to fly. There was even enough light to show them the latest in single rotor micro helicopters (weighs 1 oz) as there was no wind (miracle).

You can see from the pictures on the website that everyone had a great time. You can bet there will be a few of them bugging their parents for an RC plane come this Christmas.

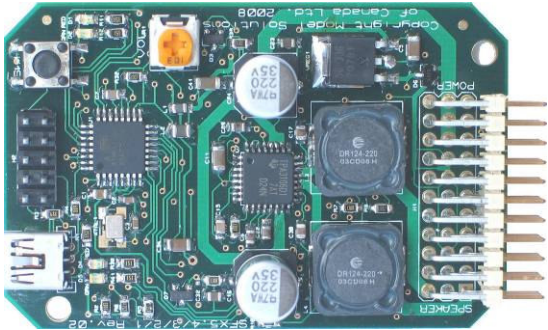
